Subject: Update from WCC

I met through Zoom with Andrea Monterio (Director, Corrections, Justice), Michael MacLennan (Superintendent), and Robert Clarke (Deputy Superintendent). In general they've done a lot of planning and assess they are in a better place than the onset of the pandemic. They have adjusted their daily routines and are reviewing their outbreak plans.

Staff:

- They don't have a physical screener at the building but they have sent out a screener that staff are to complete each day before coming to work (it's not handed into anyone just personal accountability).
- They noted that they did have one situation where a staff came to work sick with a fever but were told to go home, self-isolate and be tested (which came back negative).
- For staff who travel outside the territory (since October 27th) they've implemented mandatory masking at work.
- Generally following safe 6 **s. 25(2)(g)** and staff have been reminded.
- They've ordered 300 reusable masks (3-ply)

Inmates:

- 13K masks for their new admits/intakes
- Verbal COVID screen for all those admitted
- Some screen in for testing and are medically isolated
- Those who don't screen in are still separate for 14 days for observation
- Providing testing when needed and one in isolation awaiting results
- Contractors coming in for work or to provide services maintain physical distancing from inmates and are screened and logged prior to the visit.

Visitors:

- They've moved these to the secure area only behind glass
- COVID written screening with visitors on paper and kept if needed for contact tracing
- Getting immense pressure about visiting protocols lately. They report that most facilities across the country are in lockdown but they continue most programming as usual.

Physical changes:

- In reception are providing distancing
- Signage
- 1 person at a time in the elevators
- Distancing between inmates
- Regular cleaning and disinfecting has been incorporated.

I reinforced the safe 6 and not working sick. Supports they could use include:

- A position for a physical screener for staff/visitors
- **s. 16(1)(b)**
- A position to enhance cleaning/laundry (which they've already put in for at HR)
- More relevant support for frontline staff (rather than working from home pieces that might be more relevant to broader government staff)
- Support in writing from the MOH to support their current visiting protocols

Critical services in Yukon during COVID-19

When a critical service worker is required to self-isolate

Critical service workers who travel in or out of Yukon or the BC-Yukon border area as part of their job must self-isolate when they are not working.

If a critical worker is entering or leaving Yukon to travel for personal reasons, such as a vacation or visiting family, they must self-isolate for 14 days upon returning to Yukon.

When a critical service worker is not required to self-isolate

If a critical service worker has left Yukon as part of their job and their employer needs them to work when they return to Yukon, they can go to work to perform their duties and self-isolate when they are not working. They must abide by the [health and safety guidance recommended by the CMOH](#).

Subject: Update from WCC

I had a phone meeting with Michael MacLennan (Superintendent), and Robert Clarke (Deputy Superintendent) this morning.

The reported they have no COVID issues at present and have made some changes since our previous phone call. Here are the updates:

Staff:

- They are now doing a physical screener with all staff monitored by the shift manager on a daily basis ([copy found here](#)).
- Good compliance with mask use.

Inmates:

- Those who don't screen in for testing on admission are still separate for 14-days for observation but as a cohort grouping 3-days worth on intakes together.
- Monitored regularly on the living units and alert medical staff if any symptoms arise. These inmates are tested and isolated until the results are in.

Medical unit:

- They were without a physician for a few weeks but now have three on contract (Dr. Lazio, Dr. Shank and ?).
- They've hired a new health care coordinator s. 25(1); s. 25(2)(d) mid-January.
- Nursing staff is reported as stable, s. 25(2)(g), no lapses in coverage.

Visitors:

- They're continuing with all visits (professional and personal) only behind glass. They described this as a stool on each side of the glass and a phone between. They can accommodate a family/group on the visitor side, so not just one person at a time.
- They screen visitors before visits and were to send a copy of that screen but not yet received.
- They are interested in exploring if there are safe ways to implement face-to-face visit.
- Pre-COVID visiting:
 - Professional/lawyers could be done behind glass if violent/concerns or face-to-face.
 - Face-to-face was in a 10x15 room with a round table and 4 chairs (all bolted to the floor).

- o Family/friends visits were requested and accommodated as much as possible. These could include whole families and children.

Please let me know if there's anything else I can do to help facilitate things further.

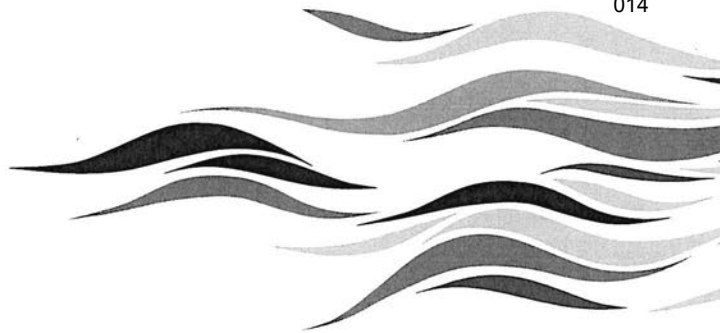
