The monotherapy with Bamlanivimab or dual therapy (with another unpronounceable drug) were all infusion based protocols for mild to mod ill patients. A lot of the indications are still evolving and there was some doubt as to whether there were really any clinically significant positive outcomes. A number of people on the panel expressed doubts as to its overall benefit and real world application in Canada. I don't think it is something that will be considered for non-hospitalized patients in CSC
