Hi Jenn

The Pacific region has raised two scenarios related to medical isolation. One is about returning medical ETAs, where they house inmates who require medical observation at RTC before returning the inmate to the parent institution and the second involves a practice unique to the Pacific region. They have created 3 medical isolation units for new admissions at Mountain, Matsqui and Mission institution. Following this medical isolation period, they place the inmates at the regional reception and assessment centre or they return them to their parent institution and are asking if they need to isolate again at RRAC or the parent institution. Can we please discuss at the core covid meeting on Monday morning, or if you prefer to discuss separately, I can set up a meeting.

Subject: RMF Clarifications Requested

Hello Bev,

As discussed here are 2 situations/scenarios that we are asking for clarification on in relation to Med Isolation Requirements for Admissions & Intra-Regional Transfers (RMF pg's: 45, 110 & 139, etc.)

1. Medical ETA's: Medium Security Medical ETA to outside hospital (e.g., OD interrupted), patient is treated/released with or without an overnight stay...then escorted to RTC for overnight observation and return to the parent institution the next day (e.g., entire movement could occur in 24-36 hrs or less).

Questions:

- a. does such a situation meet the RMF definition of an "Admission" or "Transfer" both at RTC and when the inmate returns to their parent site?
 - b. would the inmate require the 14 day medical isolation protocol be initiated both at RTC and if/when the inmate returns to their parent institution each and every time?
 - c. is there any relevance to the amount of time the inmate is outside of their parent institution or where they travel to, etc.?
2. WOC Admissions & Suspension Returns to Federal Custody: since Wave 1, the Pacific Region created and have been using Medical Isolation Units in our old Seg Units at Medium Security sites to receive mixed cohorts of WOC & Suspension Return cases from the Province of BC. These mixed cohorts are/were admitted and isolated for 14 days at which point new WOC cases are transferred/escorted to our RRAC at Pacific Institution and the TD Suspension cases are transferred/escorted to a parent institution and housed in the mainstream population. These escorts/transfers/admissions meet the definition of new admissions and/or intra-regional transfers as per

the RMF, however, they are being moved after completing 14 days of medical isolation in one of our medical isolation units.

Question:

- a. If we test these cohorted inmates between day 10-13 while in our isolation units, and their results are negative, and then we move/"transfer" them to RRAC or a Mainstream Population, the RMF requires another round of 14 day medical isolation at the receiving site upon arrival as per the definition of an ***Intra-Regional*** transfer. Can such cases under these specific circumstances (i.e., New Admissions, WOC/Return to Federal Custody) housed in our isolation units be exempted from another round of 14 day isolation upon arrival at the next site?
