**Re: Custody, Supervision and Rehabilitation Services COVID-19 Pandemic Update**

The Regina Correctional Centre is under Outbreak status for our recent rise in COVID-19 positive numbers. As of this morning, the total number of positive cases in the offender population is 16. There are several units affected:

- Unit 3A, 3B, 3C, Unit 4A/B, Unit 1C, Unit 2C3, Unit 2D3

With the aid of SHA, mass testing of all the offender population has begun with a list of prioritized units and will continue until testing is completed. This will aid the facility to weed out all positive cases and limit any progression. We wait on several recent test results, which may impact how the above units are currently being managed.

With the concern of the Delta variant, it is extremely important the offender population follow the protocols put in place throughout this pandemic. We want to minimize the spread and risk as much as possible. You, the inmate population, can assist by:

- Wearing your mask appropriately at all times when in common areas
- Cleaning and sanitizing common spaces and high touchpoint areas, including shared tables, bathrooms, and showers
- Frequently washing/sanitizing your hands, including before eating
- Taking advantage of the weekly vaccination clinics held at RCC

Vaccines help protect yourselves and those you are residing with. We have learned that our protocols (face mask wearing, cleaning, etc.) and vaccinations are effective tools in the fight against this virus. They are the best way to stop the spread of COVID-19, please make sure you are doing your part and following protocols. If you have "not" been vaccinated, now is the time to re-consider your decision. The vaccines, aid people in not becoming critically ill. If you are unsure, the nursing clinic or your Unit ADDP will be able to provide you with more information.

When going about your day, please think of what you can do to aid yourself, your unit and the facility in dealing with this current outbreak.
