RE: RCC Update- Offender Population

The total number of positive cases in the offender population is 146.

Most of RCC is on quarantine or isolation. Here is a breakdown of each unit:

1A- pending results
1BCD- isolation
2AM, 2C- isolation
2D1, 2- assessment
2D3- regular programming
3ABD- isolation, 7-day swabbing to take place on Monday
3C- regular programming
4ABCD- isolation
5AB- regular programming
6AB- assessment
7AB- assessment
8- regular programming, 7-day swabbing to take place on Monday
Dorm 1- isolation, 7-day swabbing to take place on Monday
Dorm 2- regular programming, 7-day swabbing to take place on Monday

SHA was in the facility this week, swabbing all inmates. They will be back next week to start 7-day swabbing, with the units identified above on Monday. Anyone who has recently tested positive, will not be re-swabbed. They were also here this week to vaccinate all inmates over 55+ that were eligible. Next week, they will be out to vaccinate those aged 46-54. Vaccines help protect yourselves and your families. They are the best way to stop the spread of COVID-19, make our communities safer, and can help us start to resume our normal lives and end the pandemic. Make a wise decision when it is your turn. If you are unsure, the nursing clinic will be able to provide you with more information.

Unit 3C was cleared from isolation status and returned to work in the kitchen this afternoon. As of April 22nd, we will be back to three meals/day. Lozenges and juice were handed out to the entire inmate population yesterday.

As you may have seen in the news, this outbreak is hitting people hard and fast. We take your health and safety seriously and are therefore temporarily implementing half hour night checks and will for the time being have medical staff in the facility 24 hours a day. It is VERY IMPORTANT that if you are not feeling well and/or are having troubles breathing, you must let staff know immediately. We all have a part to play in one another's safety. If you see another inmate struggling physically or in medical distress, you need to seek help from staff.
