Based on that I would suggest it be prudent to proceed with that assumption and have any close contacts work from home or remain away from the workplace as per the RTW algorithm.

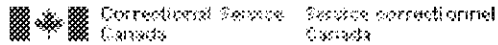

Hi Chris and Dan,

There is a staff at FVI who's husband is an asymptomatic positive. The employee, too, is asymptomatic at this time and thus PH advised her to wait until Mar 15th to be tested.

So far there are 3 close contacts, of which 2 are nurses +1 primary worker.

Given the delay in testing, is there any recommendation for the close contacts? Should they be staying off work or can they come back if rapid tests are conducted?
