Any mail received is not opened or handled for 24 hours after it is received. Workers work from home where possible. Workers are offered information regarding working from home (desk set up, healthy work environment, taking breaks, mental health contacts and work/life balance type information). Workers have received information regarding mental health from our department peer support program. Staff lunch room has been rearranged to allow social distancing and workers stagger lunch breaks. Workers are issued Lysol wipes and aggressive hand washing is encouraged. Workers have self isolated when required/suggested by public health authorities. This is a twenty-four hour, seven day per week operation with three shifts including days, afternoons and nights. [REDACTED] s.20(1) [REDACTED] s.20(1)</p> <p>[REDACTED] s.20(1) Workers at site include correctional peace officers, supervisory staff, operational service staff and administrative support. Third party workers include nursing staff employed by Alberta Health Services as well as maintenance, janitorial and culinary workers.</p> <p>The current, lower, population of the site is intentional and in response to social distancing/isolation actions taken by the courts and correctional services. There is an active HSC in place at this location which meets quarterly but which conducted an additional</p>	April 08, 2020

meeting to determine a COVID-19 response and communication plan for the site. The HSC Co-Chairs attend a COVID debriefing on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays to ensure that information and protocols are up to date and address any evolving concerns. The meetings are communicated to staff via emails and directly through daily, pre-shift briefings.

During the inspection centre representatives detailed significant controls currently in place to address the safety of workers and inmates at the site. The controls address the various roles and activities at the site and include but are not limited to the following:

Intake and Admissions:

- Police and sheriffs delivering offenders to the site s.20(1)
- s.20(1)
- s.20(1) The inmate undergoes screening allowing facility staff to determine the level of potential hazard, personal protective equipment required and other protocols to be followed prior to introducing the inmate to the facility
- All incoming inmates are equipped with surgical masks by the delivering police agency
- Designated holding cell for incoming inmates presenting symptoms of COVID-19/additional cleaning conducted once inmate clears the cell
- Three stages of screening in place including final screening by AHS prior to admittance of inmate into general population

General Operations:

- Daily briefings are held in an empty unit to allow social distancing of staff during the shift musters
 - AHS nursing staff attending pre-shift briefings
 - Travel routes to and from meetings dispersed to various access/egress to ensure social distancing is maintained for staff attending the meetings
- Staff education on new or repurposed cleaning agents to allow use of more aggressive products and increased frequency of use
 - Additional training for staff (including third party janitorial)
 - Additional posters and placement of Safety Data Sheet information on cleaning products
- Cleaning schedule doubled to increase frequency of sanitization
- Placards developed to identify any additional protection required, to be posted outside of any cell housing an inmate with identified symptoms of COVID-19 (no inmates currently identified)
- Daily self-assessment by all staff

Inmate transfer:

- Exiting inmates transferred by sheriff or correctional service vehicles
 - All transfers by correctional staff restrict the number of inmates to one inmate per compartment in the secure vehicles

- Transfers to and from court for appearance is limited through increased use of CCTV appearance and additionally reduced by lower population and early release of selected inmates that meet criteria
 - Only one inmate is allowed per CCTV cell/tank to ensure social distancing is maintained
- Vehicles and compartments cleaned immediately following transfer

Inmate Education/Social Distancing:

- Ongoing screening of inmates by front line workers including daily visit of each inmate by AHS nursing staff. this occurs every morning, seven days per week
- Management providing ongoing education to inmates on:
 - Signs and symptoms of COVID-19
 - Preventative measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 including frequent hand washing, social distancing and proper behaviours (i.e. coughing into elbow etc.)
- Meals served on rotational basis with inmates collecting their meals and returning to their bunks to eat in isolation or with limited exposure to others
- To ensure personal hygiene and hand-washing, individual use, plastic wrapped soap provided to inmates with meals three times a week
 - Inmates are able to request soap from unit staff at any time during the day as needed
 - Inmates are able to purchase additional soap through canteen
- No visitors allowed with the exception of legal and police who interact via glass divider, preventing any contact or transference of droplets

Personal protective equipment (PPE) - in addition to traditional PPE related to operation:

- Incoming inmates equipped with surgical masks
- N95 masks for staff (as required) - HSC Employee Co-Chair is certified "fit tester" and has ensured proper fit for all staff
- Nitrile gloves (as required)
- Isolation gowns (as required)
- Safety glasses/goggles (as required)
- Face shields **note: due to very limited availability of face shields, this site has engaged a local supplier who has modified operations to produce shield for this site**

Third Party Workers:

- AHS staff attending general pre shift musters
- Culinary staff now solely responsible for preparing meals with no inmates involved with meal preparation or delivery
- Janitorial and maintenance staff included in training on new products in use on site for cleaning etc.

	At OHS Officer's request, the employer representative produced a sampling of meeting minutes from the COVID debriefing meetings. The meeting minutes viewed were very detailed and included attendance of both employer and employee co-chairs. Earliest meeting produced occurred on March 17, 2020 with the most recent occurring on April 6, 2020.

Inspection	<p>Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Officer conducted an inspection on CALGARY YOUNG OFFENDER CENTRE and spoke with the Director, the employer representatives.</p> <p>OHS Officer discuss with the employer the covid-19 related bio-hazard and related control guideline such as social distances, PPE (hand gloves/mask) and visiting of client with proper protocol.</p> <p>The employer stated that they are Government funded and get all necessary supplies from them.</p> <p>Employer also stated to the Officer that they were following the AHS guideline such as Hand washing, use of sanitizer, cleaning surface and keeping social distance although is a bit difficult but effort is being made to reduce contact with the children as much as possible.</p> <p>The Employer stated that this Bio-hazard/Covid-19 is always being discussed in daily team health and safety briefing. Health screening is carried out every time on workers and client to determine who is safe to carryout their activities. The OHS officer conducted a phone inspection with the Deputy Director that included and discussed the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The worksite has the Covid health questionnaire at the one entrance for workers during the pandemic. Workers are required to report any Covid related symptoms. They also try to have a supervisor or manager available at all shift starts to personally check workers as they arrive to work. This is a secondary check to compliment the workers responsibility to self check prior to working. - They have a self isolation program. Any employee feeling or showing any Covid like symptoms must stay away from work contact 811 and self isolate for 10-14 days at the direction of AHS. Follow-up is conducted with workers to ensure they are cleared to work prior to returning. - The Executive Director and Director sent out AHS requirements for covid management which they are following. They have a copy available and will be forwarding it to the OHS officer. - They do not do temperature checks for workers. It is not a required control. - Workers have been good at self isolation before even coming to work and they are not aware of any worker that has had to be sent home. - They have a hazard assessment but they are not sure if it has been updated to include Covid. They will check with their OHS committee to confirm and advise the officer. - They have eliminated prisoner visiting and any authorized non-correctional agencies must book appointments in advance and are screened for necessity and symptoms. For those granted access must follow enhanced protocols. - Officer workstations are for single workers. All other areas are following the 6 foot physical distancing rules. - They have recently issued surgical masks for any worker working 	April 16, 2020

with inmates or any worker that may have to work within 6 feet of another worker. They AHS personnel have provided training for any worker using masks before they get them. They also have a video of the training for workers to revisit.

- They have adjusted some rooms to allow for physical distancing.
- There are Covid related posters throughout the building.
- There are no positions in the center that will allow for working from home.
- They have a person who answers the phone. When they are away from their desk now they use call forwarding for answering rather than someone filling in at their desk.
- They are following frequent handwashing recommendations and have increased availability of hand sanitizer, auto dispense soap machines and Lysol wipes.
- They have increased cleaning and disinfecting in the centre.
- They have a directive to let incoming mail sit for 24 hours before handling.

No more than two workers are allowed in a station at a time but the stations are for single workers to work their shifts. - New surgical masks are mandatory for workers working with inmates or within 6 feet of any other person. Each worker has or will receive facemask training from their AHS workers prior to wearing of the supplied masks. - There are Covid related posters throughout the building for self assessing, how to wear masks, hand washing, coughing etiquette, etc. - Frequent handwashing is required, Extra auto soap dispensers have been installed and there is a good supply of soap and hand sanitizer. - Workers have been wondering about temperature taking and the member was advised it is not a mandatory requirement. <p>The information provided by the committee member was consistent with information already received. - and workers who require them have been appropriately fit tested.
- o Disinfectant wipes and hand sanitizer is readily available to workers.
 - o Any worker entering the facility and working in the facility is to wear a mask if physical distancing of 2m is not possible.
 - o The cleaning crew has increased from 2 to 6 cleaners, and enhanced sanitation procedures include disinfecting frequently contacted surfaces. Common areas such as the recreation area are cleaned before, during and after each use.
 - o Outside access (example – lawyers) has been restricted to primarily remote meetings. If remote meetings are not possible, in person meetings are conducted with physical barriers in place.
 - o Inmates must complete a health screening questionnaire prior to entering. If inmates report that they are experiencing symptoms of illness, they are provided a mask and consult with AHS healthcare staff.
 - o Staff are required to report if they are experiencing symptoms of illness. If symptoms of illness are present, they are not to report to work / sent home and instructed to call 811.
 - o Code response procedures have been updated, requiring full PPE prior to entering an isolation cell.
 - o Inmate transport loads have been reduced to ensure inmates have individual compartments.
 - o Inmates have been provided bars of soap to facilitate frequent handwashing.
- o Pre-shift staff briefing has moved into a larger area whereby chairs are spaced for adequate social distancing. Updates/new information is shared at these briefings.
- o Emails are sent to staff from management communicating updates as applicable.
 - o Nursing staff has provided training on proper donning of PPE and infection prevention and control.
 - o Cleaning supervisors have received additional training in the past on infection prevention and control cleaning procedures.
 - o Increased signage has been posted.
 - o Directors speak directly with staff and inmates regularly to provide updates.
 - o The AHS Health Care Manager attends the daily management meetings and provides updates.
 - o Daily briefings are documented and summaries are distributed to staff.
 - o Operational supervisors are available for staff questions.
- o The Deputy Director expressed concerns about maintaining PPE levels. The Deputy Director indicated that the department is actively sourcing PPE to ensure adequate levels will be available.
- o The work site hazard assessment reflects biohazards, and controls are identified accordingly.

A discussion was had regarding ensuring workers are following the required procedures for PPE use. Employer must ensure that workers are trained in proper donning and doffing of personal protective equipment, including gloves - OHS reviewed the employers COVID-19 hazard assessment. The results of the assessment were documented and emailed to workers on April 3, 2020 - workers are no longer using fleet pooled vehicles, and are only utilizing personal vehicles - workers are being contacted by supervisors twice a day to check-in when workers are working from home - OHS reviewed the Facility Emergency Response Plan for the worksite. The plan included the required elements of Section 116 of the Alberta OHS Code, however a discussion was had regarding updating the plan to include procedures to be followed in the case of pandemics - OHS reviewed the employers site-specific hazard assessment. Below is a summary of the call:</p> <p>As of the time of the call there have been no reported cases of Covid-19 at the facility.</p> <p>The inspection was broken down into 5 areas of discussion: intake of new prisoners, how the employer is adhering to the Chief Medical Officers recommendations, the use and issuance of personal protective equipment, the scope and role of Alberta Health Services and the perspective from the bargaining unit.</p> <p>Prisoner Intake: Prisoner intake occurs as per usual. If law enforcement identifies an individual in their custody that is presenting symptoms or is known to have Covid-19 they will call ahead and notify staff at the ERC. ERC staff along with a representative from AHS will don the identified personal protective equipment consisting of cloth coveralls, a surgical mask, gloves, goggles + face shield. Law enforcement will generally put a mask on the prisoner as an extra precaution. Upon arrival AHS will ask a series of questions to gauge the prisoners medical information. If the individual is symptomatic they are streamed to an isolation unit where AHS can further assess.</p>	April 22, 2020

Should further medical treatment be necessary there is an infirmary on site.

Due to the rapidly evolving situation regarding Covid-19 a new initiative began at the worksite for staff to use masks anytime they are in close proximity to anyone.

Chief Medical Officers recommendations:

All staff facilities : gym, fitness facilities were closed on March 17, 2020.

As the directives from the CMO are issued they are implemented. Originally the employer reduced the number of people permitted in a single area to less than 50 however as the information evolved that number has been reduced to no more than s.20(1)

There is now a max occupancy of no more than s.20(1) anywhere in the facility.

Shift change Muster Meetings are no longer taking place.

Management meetings only take place in spaces large enough to comply with the social distancing requirements.

Cleaning at the facility is provided by a third party contractor who has increased the frequency of cleaning for all high touch surface areas.

Staff are screened at the start of each shift.

Each unit is equipped with 36 cells with double occupancy. To comply with the CMO's directives the employer has limited the number of inmates who can leave a cell to no more than 12 at a time. This is done on a rotational basis.

Inmates are responsible for cleaning their cells , the common areas of the unit and the phones that are available for inmate use. Inmates are provided cleaning agents to perform this work.

Personal Protective Equipment

All personal protective equipment provided by the employer is provided through the Provincial Operations Center (POC).

On any given day there are approximately 550 people(Correctional Officers, Cleaners, contractors, AHS) onsite. Each day an individual will use 4 masks throughout a shift accounting for a daily mask use of approximately 2200.

The employer is constantly monitoring their PPE usage and have even begun sourcing their own supplies through different suppliers.

The employer originally attempted using disposable Tyvek coveralls but found maintaining a constant supply onsite was difficult. Now fabric coveralls are provided by the employer for instances of required close contact ie: new prisoner displaying symptoms intake. There are onsite laundry facilities available at the worksite.

Training for the specialized use and donning/doffing of the personal protective equipment for staff is provided by pre-existing specialized units that exist in the facility. The employer already has to protect staff against other biological agents, narcotics etc so the additional requirements to protect against Covid-19 were pre-existing at the worksite.

Alberta Health Services
 The scope and role of AHS at the worksite is to provide health and medical services to inmates.
 AHS was involved in the pre-planning for the response to Covid-19 at the worksite.
 AHS provides guidance/consultation to correctional staff on how to implement the directions from the Chief Medical Officer.
 Performing the daily screening of all 1100 inmates at the facility. Any identified individuals are brought to the Medical Assessment Treatment room (MAT) for further assessment. If required the inmate can be brought to the infirmary.
 AHS is involved in how long an inmate must be isolated for.
 Covid-19 is not the only virus or illness that may be present at the facility.
 If an outbreak were to occur at the facility, AHS would be involved in outbreak management as well.

Bargaining Unit/JWHSC chair(worker)
 Corrections staff work very closely with AHS when performing their duties to minimize duplicate interactions with an inmate.
 Staff at facility are familiar with the required controls as there have been previous virus outbreaks in the past that the facility had to protect against.
 Representative feels that the recommendations from AHS have been exceeded.

(g) bring along equipment or materials needed and be accompanied and assisted by a person who has special, expert or professional knowledge of a matter relevant to the inspection,

(i) require the employer or a person designated by the employer to demonstrate the use of any machinery, equipment, appliance or thing at a work site, and

(a) the owner or person in possession of it consents to the entry and examination, or

(b) the entry and examination is authorized by a judge under subsection (3).

(3) Where a judge of the Provincial Court is satisfied on an officer's evidence under oath that there are reasonable grounds for an officer to exercise a power under this section and that

(a) in the case of a room or place actually used as a private dwelling, the officer cannot obtain consent under subsection (2)(a), or

(b) having obtained consent under subsection (2)(a), the officer has been obstructed or interfered with,

the judge may make any order the judge considers necessary to enable the officer to exercise the powers under this section.
