Hi Laura,

I've reviewed the document pages, 1-6, Annex, A,B,D. A few comments,

Stand-by

- Physician must be available on stand-by during CSC organized COVID-19 vaccination clinics, to provide professional guidance by telephone or in person, within 15 minutes of receiving a call.

It might be good to define what is meant by standby, is it to respond in x minutes in person, or just by phone?
See addition in red above, is this okay?

On-call

- Physician must provide on-call services to vaccinated employees and contractors in close contact with inmates after the COVID-19 vaccination clinics. Follow-up on-call services will include professional medical advice on adverse events stemming from the vaccination and consultation with employees and contractors as required.

I'm not clear what this means. Does it mean to answer questions or concerns of staff who are on the site 24x7 or all staff for x days. I would have thought they'd cover off any immediate issues but other questions or concerns after they've left the site would be their own physician/ public health lines/ED. When I get my flu shot this year it was at the pharmacy, so I would call my family doctor for any issue afterwards not the pharmacist. This one will be difficult if left as is. This was included to respond to any adverse effects after vaccination. If this responsibility falls to the employee's primary physician than we may be able to remove the on-call clause all together. Any immediate adverse events would be covered through the stand-by clause. Do you agree with removing the on-call clause?

The insurance clause would be best if it included wording that CMPA coverage was acceptable or if not covered by CMPA then malpractice to cover 1million would be required. Ginette discussed this with contracting and to my understanding this was agreed,
