- GOAL 4 -Foster participation of Inuit in the delivery of health care
- GOAL 5 -Protect, preserve and promote Inuit traditional knowledge and healing practices.
- GOAL 6 -Provide Inuit with knowledge of environmental health risks.



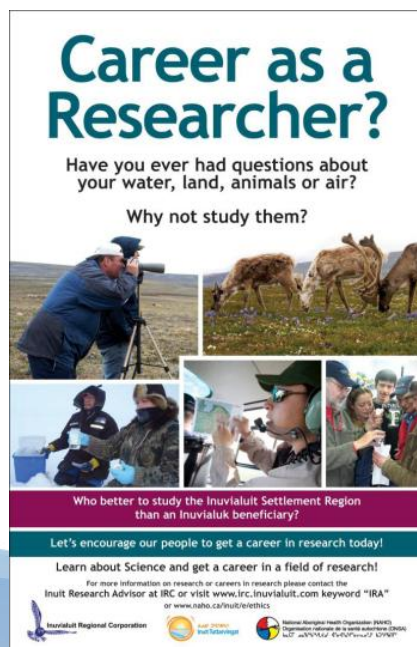
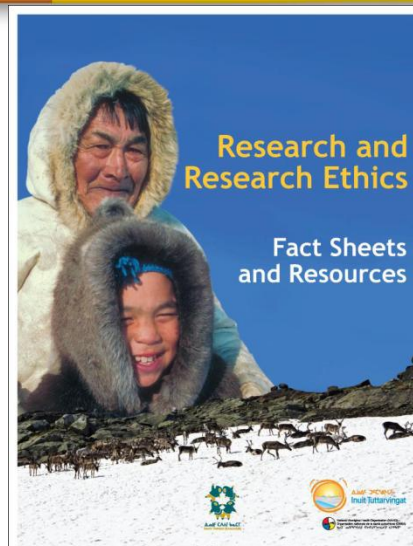
Supporting Informed and Respectful Research
