However, a student may request an embargo period by completing the “Embargo request form” and submitting it with the service request “Approval Final Version of the Thesis”. When the service request is approved, the student will then deposit his/her thesis online through uO Research. Once the service request and the thesis submission to uO Research are approved, the embargo period is irrevocable.
